Bring the others if you have them - you don't have to go and purchase all of these. You can build up a collection slowly, or we can mix most of these. We won't be using the following colours in our workshop, but if you are building up your supplies - some nice to haves are: <i>Burnt Umber, Raw Sienna, perhaps a Black</i> In general, with art supplies it is more economical to purchase a larger size.
PAPER 3-4 sheets of A4 350gsm paper or card even better	Brackens Warehouse Stationery Any Art Supply Store	Get heavy paper, or even card can be used for the colour mixing ref cards
MEDIUMS Bring one type medium to match your choice of acrylic, or oil if you can.		Mixing mediums thin down the paint, making mixing easier
OLD CERAMIC DINNER PLATE	Op Shops	For mixing paint. Can also use a mixing palette if you have one.
